RESOLUTION; IN SUPPORT OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO VIRGINIA CODE SECTION 24.2-304.1; AT-LARGE AND DISTRICT ELECTIONS

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the County of Prince George, Virginia, this 23rd day of November, 2010, does hereby support to amend Virginia Code §24.2-304.1 relating to at-large and district elections by amending paragraph C as follows:

C. For the purposes of reapportioning representation in 2001 and every ten years thereafter, the governing body of a county, city, or town shall use the most recent decennial population figures for such county, city, or town from the United States Bureau of the Census, which figures are identical to those from the actual enumeration conducted by the United States Bureau of the Census for the apportionment of representatives in the United States House of Representatives, except that the census data for this apportionment purpose will not include any population figure which is not allocated to specific census blocks within the Commonwealth, even though that population may have been included in the apportionment population figures of the Commonwealth for the purpose of allocating United States House of Representatives seats among the states. In any county, city, or town containing a state, federal or regional adult correctional facility whose inmate population, as determined by the information provided by those facilities, on the date of the decennial census exceeded twelve percent of the total population of such election district according to the decennial census, the

governing body of such locality may elect to exclude such inmate population for the purposes of the decennial reapportionment.
